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President's Message

Dear members,

he first half of 2023 is already past with our many happy festive celebrations and we are now looking straight into the beginning of the second half, which may yet prove to be more challenging. Although Retail Group Malaysia has revised its annual growth rate in retail sales for 2023 to 4.0% (an upward adjustment of 0.5% point from its projection made in November last year), the overall recovery of our economy is not as expected. Our currency has become weaker in comparison with others in the region, but this may yet work for the better, and attract more inbound tourism and shoppers. Nevertheless, shopping malls will have to be on their toes to brace for more challenges coming our way, for example, amongst others, the increased cost of doing business and shoppers' lower purchasing power.

Shopping malls are facing a continuous increase in operational costs and whilst we are grateful for the recent announcement of a nominal drop in Imbalance Cost Pass-Through (ICPT) surcharges until end-2023, malls have to be extra vigilant through prudent controls on electricity usage, not to lose even this marginal savings. With this scenario, it will definitely be critical and more timely than ever to undertake energy saving and efficiency measures and source for alternative energy solutions. Therefore, to create better awareness, our recent events have looked at sustainability through the digitalisation of mall maintenance procedures, energy management, renewable solar energy and green certification.

On the shopping front, we have resumed our study trips to recce malls overseas and the first foray was to our neighbour, Bangkok. Tourists with shopping on their agenda have traditionally been enamoured with their street markets but Bangkok malls have so much character and much more to offer, especially in leisure and entertainment, luxury fashion and international cuisine, inspiring indoor gardens and landscapes and even washrooms with imaginative decors. Needless to say, participants of our trips all returned with fresh insights and creative ideas. So, hopefully we can look forward to new and exciting concepts at our malls in due course.

As announced, submissions for the PPKM Awards for Best Experiential Marketing 2023 have been launched and all member malls are invited to participate and showcase their best marketing efforts as these Awards are due recognition for the outstanding marketing projects from our member malls.

We are also planning our forthcoming conference for the third quarter 2023, themed REINVENTING SHOPPING MALLS – The Paradigm Shift. The past few challenging years have certainly reshaped retail and malls so we are looking at new paradigms in our industry. We look forward to share industry insights from our learned speakers, especially from malls on the cutting edge who will make their entrance soon. So, do look out for our announcements and to meet up with you at the event soon.





As some participants shared, it was an 'overall good learning experience' and 'all the malls had different characteristics and were fascinating'.

Central Festival Eastville (CFE) was designed with the concept of The New Nature Experience of Bangkok. Indeed, nature was both indoors and outdoors, as part of the beautifully landscaped mall was open-air with natural ventilation, which at times, proved to be very warm thereby cleverly driving shoppers into the air-conditioned retail spaces. Open since 2015, CFE is very pet-friendly with a specific area offering a 'Dog & Cat Cart Service' for shoppers to stroll with their pets all over the mall, as well as discreet facilities for pet waste disposal. Above it all, the Sky Run, an open air running track is located on the top floor together with FarmLab - altogether the most unique amenities found in a typical shopping mall.













Asiatique The Riverfront opened in 2012 as a shopping and leisure space, having been converted from the docks and warehouses built during the late 1890's. This clever re-use of the defunct port successfully combines two of the most popular shopping experiences in Bangkok, a night bazaar and a mall and also offers entertainment and the international dining choices.



At both Terminal 21 Asok and Terminal 21 Rama 3 malls in Bangkok, each retail floor represents different touristic cities from around the world with London, Paris, Tokyo, Istanbul, San Francisco and Rome at Asok whilst Rama 3 features Caribbean Street, Paris, London, Istanbul, Tokyo, San Francisco and Hollywood. These malls' one-of-a-kind experience involves our basic necessities at the washrooms a.k.a. toilets, with the décor leading to and inside the mall toilets being uniquely themed after the various locations. Participants reckoned that the cleaning and maintenance must be meticulous and indeed, the toilets had high standards of hygiene and cleanliness. Both malls offered specialty stores and fashion shops plus a value-for-money food court and hundreds of instagrammable spots over all the floors.















At yet another mall, **Emquartier**, the unique feature here is the impressive spiral walkway with food and beverage outlets lined along both sides. Opened since 2015 and directly linked to the BTS Sky Train station which was also landscaped by the mall developers, Emquartier also has a suspended landscaped centrepiece décor with an open-air garden on the fifth floor and a five-storey waterfall. It is one of the three malls in the 'EM District', including the existing Emporium and EmSphere currently under construction.







The well-known Siam Paragon is one of the most popular shopping malls in Bangkok, housing, amongst others, multiple international high-end fashion brands, luxury car showrooms, an aquarium and a comprehensive selection of world cuisine. The focus at Siam Paragon is fashionable, luxury living.

Within close walking distance are its sister malls, Siam Centre and Siam Discovery which have been extensively renovated and relaunched respectively as Siam Centre – The Ideaopolis, focusing on imagination and creativity and Siam Discovery – The Exploratorium. The interior décor of Siam Discovery is unusual and somewhat 'arty' and styles itself as the first and biggest specialty lifestyle store.









IconSiam opened in 2018 and is known as the 'Mother of All Malls' offering high-end brands, an indoor floating market, Sook Siam, an art gallery and an exhibition space. The eye-catching dining zone 'Paradise of Eatery' on the sixth floor is designed by leading Thai artists and also houses the mall's iconic 15-meter waterfall. With its beautiful riverside location, it also features a fountain show every evening.





Central World is one of Bangkok's largest malls with the largest Apple Store in South East Asia. It originally opened in 1990 as the Word Trade Centre but has since gone through several extensive renovations and in 2005, relaunched with its current name. Adjacent to Central World is the Bangkok Convention Centre and a five-star hotel. It is also probably one of very few malls with its supermarket located on the top floor.

Webinar: The Shopping Mall Synergy

6 APRIL 2023


With the shopping malls of today being largely situated in mixed developments, 121 participants joined our three speakers to explore the shopping synergy between various 'diverse' components like medical facilities and convention centres as well as in the context of a planned township.

Participants benefitted from Mr Francis Teo, President, Malaysian Association of Convention & Exhibition and Suppliers (MACEOS) as he looked at *The MICE Nexus*. When convention centres are located in the vicinity of malls, it creates a win-win situation for both. Malls benefit from increased foot traffic and exposure to the large numbers of visitors that frequent conventions and tradeshows, whereas convention centres benefit from easy access to goods and services that they may

require while hosting events.

Mr Darren Chear, Director, Branding and Communications, Sunway Malls shared about Sunway's smart city model which showcased *Partnership for Positive Vibes*. Over the past 30 years, Sunway had transformed the tin mining wasteland into a wonderland with sustainable activities like shopping, entertainment, education and community engagement. Sunway's seamless connectivity includes Malaysia's first fully-independent public transport system, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and the elevated canopy walk across the township, built with lower carbon footprint, solar panel rooftop and surveillance.

En Khairul Ariffin Ibrahim, COO Hektar Property Services, explored the 'greenfield' Linking Shopping x Medical Tourism where malls can collaborate with medical facilities in the vicinity to provide services for medical travellers and their families.

Continuing the popular webinar series with the same genre, Series 3 featured retailers like Mr Ben Lee, General Manager, MINISO who shared how Miniso Rebrands Itself with the reinvigoration of


The webinar drew attention from 89 participants who found it informative as well as fruitful to the shopping mall business.

The three speakers, each specialised in their own field, shared with 124 participants on renewable energy in today's rapidly changing climate environment. Ir Ashwin Thurairajah, Executive Director, GreenRE spoke on how green certification can lead to energy efficiency and contribute towards sustainable energy for commercial buildings including shopping malls.

Muhammad Zulkhairee Md Zabani, Assistant Director, SEDA Malaysia pointed out to participants that *Energy Audit Conditional Grant Program (EACG) Under RMK-12* was still available to interested members and how to apply for the audit funds.

Defining Energy Solutions Mr Niranpal Singh, Managing Director, BayWa r.e Malaysia explored renewable energy procurement solutions from on-site and off-site solar systems and he shared the savings from case studies featuring our member malls.

REMINDER

The Board of Valuers, Appraisers, Estate Agents and Property Managers (BOVAEP) has revised its **Guidelines on Continuing Professional Development (CPD)** regarding requirements for the submission of CPD credit hours for renewal for 2024 as follows:

Authority to Practise for Valuers, Appraisers, Estate Agents and Property Managers

- A total of 10 CPD credit hours per annum, with a minimum of 5 CPD credit hours to be attended physically for registrants who are 55 years and below.
- A total of 5 CPD credit hours per annum, with a minimum of 3 CPD credit hours to be attended physically for registrants who are above 55 years old.

Strata Management Seminar: Do It Right The First Time Kuching

With the recently implemented Strata Management Ordinance (SMO) 2019 in Kuching, the seminar was organised to create greater awareness and educate practitioners in the pertinent aspects of managing commercial premises in mixed developments. Officers from the relevant authorities, experienced speakers, hands-on practitioners and a legal expert shared their perspectives on the local scenario in Sarawak.

The first speaker, **Tuan Hj Abu Bakar Hj Sepawi**, Division Head, Local Government Division, Ministry of Public Health, Housing and Local Government, Sarawak looked at the *Role of the Commissioner of Buildings (COB), Sarawak*. This was followed by **Datu Sr Sudarsono Osman**, Managing Director, ACE Geomatics who delved into *Strata Development in Sarawak*.

The afternoon session continued with **Ms Lee Kim Noor**, Principal, KN Lee Associates who shared The *Wish List of Strata Management Ordinance 2019*, *Sarawak* whilst **Mr Richard Chan**, Advisor, PPK Malaysia/Director Consultant, RCMC took a practical look at the problems and solutions of *Managing Mixed Strata Properties*.

There was a lively discussion during the panel sessions with the 27 participants seeking useful opinions from the speakers. Participants also sought further training programmes on the SMO.
