TURNING A NEW PAGE In Shopping Malls

n life, Turning a New Page often means changes in lifestyle, home, friends, environment etc., and we encounter this very often, true to the adage that *The Only Constant is Change*.

For shopping malls, this means evolution - sometimes revolution (!) - of many aspects in mall management, involving the adaptation to changing consumer trends as well as adoption of innovative strategies and directions.

We take a quick look at the key essential areas for Turning a New Page in shopping malls

Experiential Shopping

This essentially means creating a vibrant and exciting environment in the mall where patrons can linger longer, often within a festive ambience with pretty visual displays coupled with seasonal pop-up stores to entice shoppers. To add more excitement, malls can curate specific retail experiences and partner with local artisans, niche, high-end brands or even branded merchandisers and organisations to cater to specific tastes or trends to add diversity to mall visits.

Tenant and Merchandise Mix

To remain competitive and attractive to shoppers, malls must continue to enhance their tenant and merchandise mix. This may mean unique brands, maybe the first to open in Malaysia or flagship stores of popular retailers or even a designated location for specifically themed stores and food and beverage (F&B) innovations. Some malls have intentionally developed their F&B offerings and become wellknown for their wide selection of outlets because where the stomach beckons, people will be drawn into retail therapy as there is a correlation between the nature of food experiences and consumer activities.



Community Spaces

With more than half of urban families streaming into malls, especially during the public holidays and weekends, it simply makes sense to offer more recreational spaces for the community within the malls. Amongst others, these spaces can include a sports centre, exercise area, jogging track, public park or garden, urban farms, designated pet-friendly areas and even a place for performing arts and more.

Malls in Mixed Developments

Many malls are built within mixed developments encompassing offices, residences, hotels, colleges, art galleries, hospitals, health and wellness centres in close vicinity. It would just make sense to integrate facilities and amenities for a vibrant live-work-play environment where the mall provides for the needs of its captive market, that is, creating the mall's own eco-system where each component plays its own role and contributes to the positive synergy.

Facilities, Amenities, Services and more

Malls have evolved over the years to now offer much more than just shopping. Within the live-work-play model, patrons can spend the entire day (and night!) in a mall complex doing errands, shopping, eating and patronising the leisure and entertainment outlets, adventure parks and much more.

There is also a growing trend for holistic lifestyles. So there is a demand for organic cafes, eco-friendly retail, fitness centres, beauty clinics, spa facilities, health and beauty clinics and the like. Some extra services in some malls include assistance to locate patrons' vehicles within the car park, help for minor vehicle breakdowns, delivery of purchases, drivers' lounge and multi-lingual customer service personnel.

Digitalisation

Malls would definitely keep up if they embrace digitalisation and engage in social media to market and promote events, sales and promotions. Engaging with patrons and shoppers through social media platforms fosters a sense of community and encourage interaction but this interaction may need to be moderated. Many malls nowadays connect to their shoppers using mobile apps or loyalty programmes, which ensure mall allegiance.

With the current engagement by many on social media, it also makes sense to create unique 'instagrammable' spots in and around the mall's common areas locations – and you may be surprised that these not only attract the younger generation but even the not-so-oldies to take selfies too!

Sustainability

This is not only a response to climate issues and a moral imperative to protect our world for the future, but it simply means managing malls the smart way in today's environment. In malls, sustainability practices should include essential spheres like energy efficiency, waste management and community engagement. Besides doing our bit for the world we live in, consumers are increasingly conscious of environmental issues and malls' alignment with sustainability can attract them to the mall. There are already malls which have taken the lead in sustainability and we hope there will be many more, if not all eventually, which will jump on the band

Simply put, consideration of the above strategies are evolving to meet changing needs. They can propel shopping malls to turn a new page and do better in the long run

Adapt and adopt, the way to go.

SUSTAINABLE MALLS AND RETAILPioneering the ESG Frontier

Spearheading the matter of SUSTAINABILITY, PPKM collaborated with Fuller Academy to organise the seminar which attracted more than 100 participants, including speakers from neighbouring countries. Shopping malls have increasingly embraced practices for Environment, Social and Governance (ESG) and as community centres, are natural hubs to increase awareness and launch related educational programmes.

The seminar sparked insightful discussions on sustainability practices for the shopping mall and retail sectors with keynote sessions, workshops and panel discussions amongst well-experienced practitioners and experts. It was a most fruitful and useful seminar with the majority of participants believing that sustainability should be a top priority for malls. In this instance, malls should look at energy efficiency, waste management and community engagement. Overall, it was deemed 'very insightful sharing about sustainability practices in retail malls', with some participants preferring a longer duration in order to cover more in-depth perceptions.
